Oregon Track Club Project to Honor the Legacy of Hayward Field Officials



Oregon Track Club Officials Committee has been developing an Officials Legacy Project to honor the many decades of volunteer service by track and field officials at Hayward Field. Since 1958, Oregon Track Club (OTC) has collaborated with the University of Oregon to recruit, train, and mentor officials for UO home meets. That relationship continues today.

The heart of the legacy project will feature video documentaries of current and former Hayward officials sharing stories of how they got involved in officiating and their personal experiences officiating meets at Historic Hayward Field.

A small production crew of creative University of Oregon journalism and advertising students will produce the video segments. The filming of these documentaries began in early January.

The OTC Officials Committee is working with the University to possibly have the legacy video presentation as an exhibit in Hayward Hall, an interactive space that is located under the east seating area of Hayward Field.

Women's Sport Summit Set for May 1-3

The National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) has announced that registration is now open for the first-ever NFHS women's sport summit. The event, "Better Together: Women and Sport Leadership Virtual Summit," will be held May 1-3 for **administrators, coaches, and officials** at the interscholastic level. The Summit takes place on the 50th birthday celebration of Title IX.

The event is billed as an outstanding professional development opportunity with an impressive lineup of speakers, including keynote addresses by Betsy Butterick (Communications Specialist), Violet Palmer (first female NBA referee), and Dr. Jen Welter (first female NFL coach). There will also be session speakers from all sports including Dr. Bonnie Edmondson who will be talking about, "How to Use Your Power to Empower."

The three-day event will combine standalone speakers and moderated panels for three different groups (administrators, coaches, and officials), as well as general sessions for all attendees.

Now in his fourth season as a professional athlete with Oregon Track Club Elite, Vince Ciattei finally feels like he's getting close to his potential.

After two lost years due to injury and the pandemic, Ciattei broke out last season with a string of personal bests, his first Wanda Diamond League appearance at the



Prefontaine Classic, and a berth in the finals of the 1,500 meters at the U.S. Olympic Trials.

Although his tenth-place finish at the Trials was not the result he was looking for, the 27-year-old native of Baltimore closed out the season as the eighth-fastest American in the 1,500m with his newly-minted PR of 3:34.57.
